### **COVID-19 VACCINATION**

We were excited and delighted to receive our first delivery of the Pfizer/BioNTech vaccine in December 2020.

Our vaccination programme has now started, with those 80 years of age and over. The order in which people will be offered the vaccine is based on advice from the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI).

Dr Gethin Lane said: "The roll-out of the COVID-19 vaccination is a real positive step forward in the fight against the pandemic. This will be the largest vaccination programme in the history of the NHS. Our staff, together with colleagues across our Primary Care Network, have worked hard to make sure that we have everything in place in order to sustain a safe, smooth and efficient vaccination programme. Thank you, to all our staff."

Please do not ring the practice to try and book a vaccine. We will contact you when your vaccination is due.

When we do contact you, act immediately and make sure you attend your appointments.

Please: wear a face covering unless exempt; use the intercom on arrival; sanitise your hands; have your temperature checked.

The vaccination will be given as an injection in the upper arm. Recipients will be monitored for 15 minutes after the vaccination. It will be given in two doses, at least 21 days apart.
