CLINICAL TRIAGE UPDATE

Kirkburton Health Centre introduced an online triage system in November 2023. Under the new system, all requests for urgent or routine clinician appointments require the completion of an online triage form, econsult. The online forms are reviewed by our clinical triage team the same day, and often within the hour, in our clinical triage hub. The hub is staffed by a GP, (two on Monday) and Advanced Clinical Practitioner or GP Registrar.

Dr Waller said: "After six months, we have found clinical triage is much better than our previous system for patients and staff. Ninety-eight percent of patients have been offered an appointment within two weeks, compared to 72% in our previous system. Our staff have embraced new ways of working and value the teamwork, support, and commitment of colleagues."

Benefits of clinical triage

- Better use of technology
- Reduced telephone wait times
- No longer the frustration of having to call at 8.00am, or call back the following day
- Consistent and more efficient approach to how we deliver care
- All requests receive a senior clinical triage the same day and often within the hour
- The skills of our healthcare team are better used
- GPs can focus on patients in specific need of their expertise
- Improved access to an appropriate clinician for all our patients
- As a GP Training Practice, our clinical triage hub is an excellent learning environment for GP registrars.

INTRODUCING PHARMACY FIRST

Under the new NHS Pharmacy First scheme, you can now receive advice and treatment from your local community pharmacy for the following common conditions:

- Earache 1 to 17 years
- Impetigo 1 year and over
- Infected insect bites 1 year and over
- Shingles 18 years and over
- Sinusitis 12 years and over
- Sore throat 5 years and over
- Urinary tract infections women 16-64 years

The Pharmacist will consider your medical history and any medications you may currently be taking and recommend the best course of action for your condition.

The Practice has invited patients who used our online triage system in February and March to complete a confidential survey. The survey has been developed by our Patient Participation Group. Key aims of the survey are to assess patient understanding, ease of use, support offered when using iPads or telephone, and suggest recommendations for improvement. We are committed to reviewing the online system regularly to make sure that we meet the needs of our patients."
