FEEDBACK FROM OUR ONLINE TRIAGE SYSTEM SURVEY

Our new online triage system was introduced in November. The Practice is committed to capturing patient feedback - directly and through regular surveys. A questionnaire developed by the PPG was launched in June. The findings from June to August data, shows that overall patients are adapting well to the new approach and have a clear understanding of the system and benefits.

The practice has acted on feedback to improve patient experience and extend choice. Several improvements have been made:

- A computer, keyboard and screen has been installed in a side room, offering patients privacy, access to the internet and technology.
- A shorter version of e-consult E-lite has been introduced

The survey is work-in-progress and will continue to be issued to monitor patient feedback.

Dr Waller said: "The new system has improved access to an appropriate health care professional for all patients. As a training practice, the clinical triage hub is an excellent learning environment for our GP registrars."

ANNUAL GP PATIENT SURVEY

NHS England has published the results from their annual GP Patient Survey. The completion rate for our Practice was 33% (98 surveys returned out of 301 surveys sent out in January). The overall experience of Kirkburton Health Centre is **Good**. The results are available at www.gp-patient.co.uk.

The GP Patient Survey is an independent survey run by Ipsos Mori on behalf of NHS England. The survey is sent out in January each year to more than two million people, randomly selected from the NHS list of patients registered with a GP. The survey is carried out securely and information does not identify individuals.

Julie Lambe, Practice Business Manager, said: "We encourage patients who receive a questionnaire in January, to complete it. The survey is an opportunity for patients to share their experience and for the practice to work on what needs to improve and what is working well."
